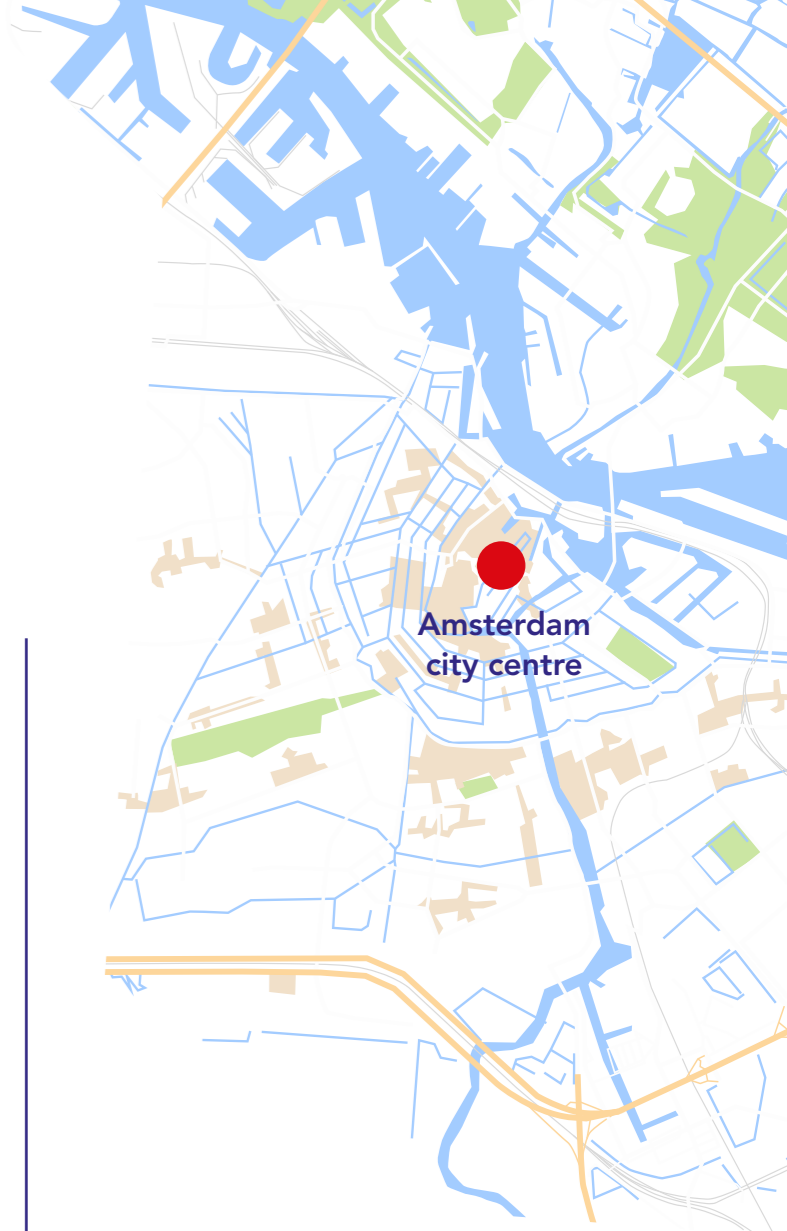

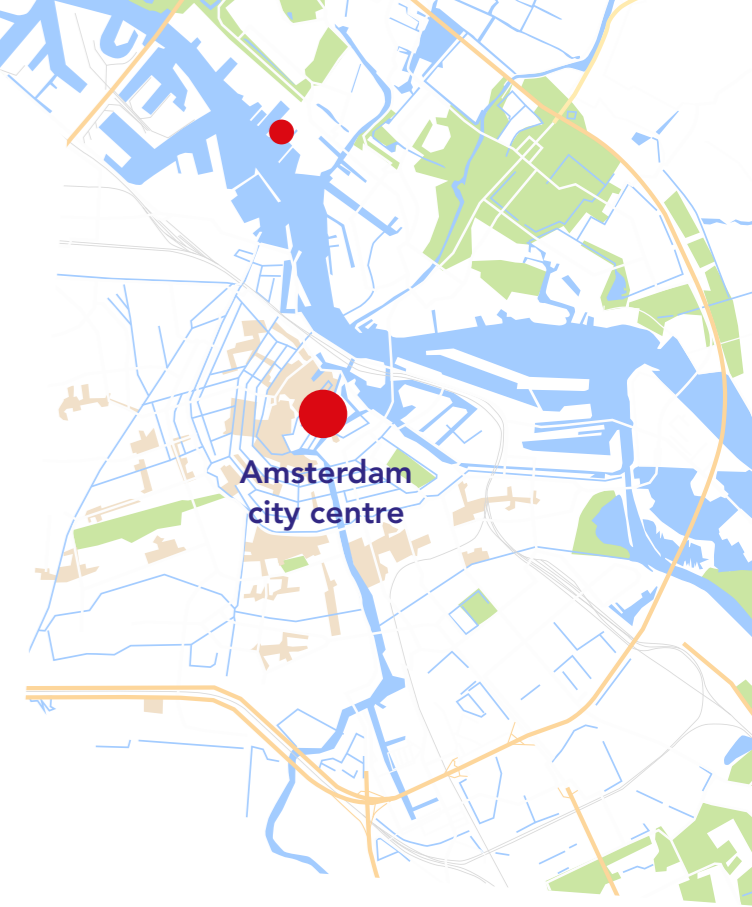

Amsterdam Marina

The modern Amsterdam Marina, with 350 berths for yachts and superyachts, is located on the north bank of IJ river near the Amsterdam city centre. The marina, featuring a futuristic harbour office, is on an old shipyard site that has been developed into a trendy hotspot. A free ferry service, approximately 300m from the marina, runs directly to Amsterdam central station and the city centre.

Amsterdam Marina is part of Jachthavengroep together with sister marinas Rotterdam Marina, Regatta Center Medemblik, Marina Stellendam and Marina Schokkerstrand.

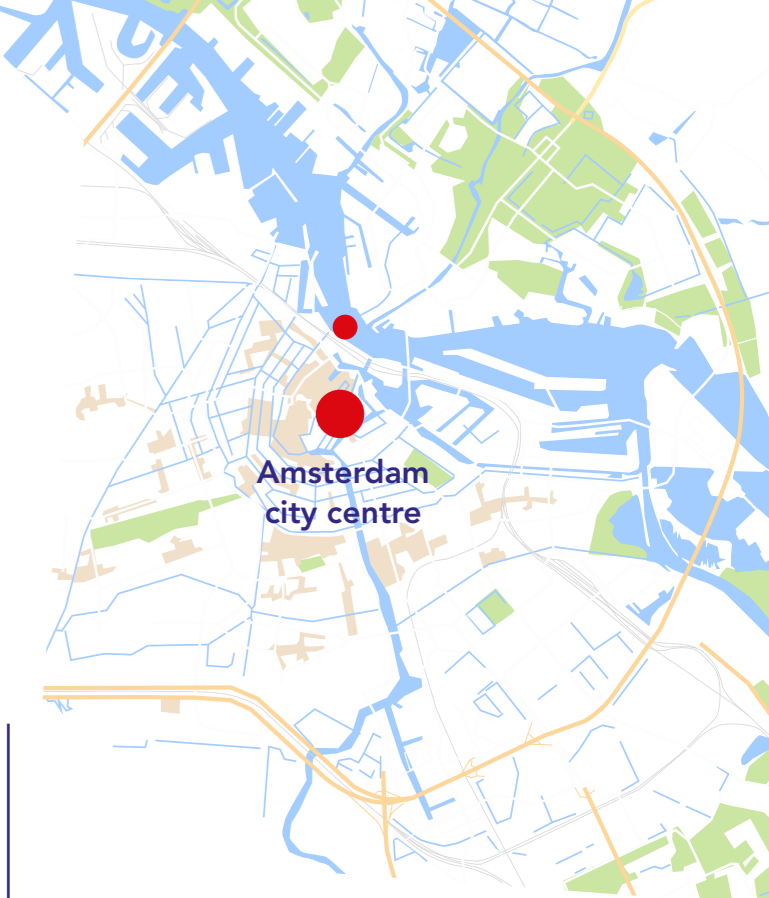

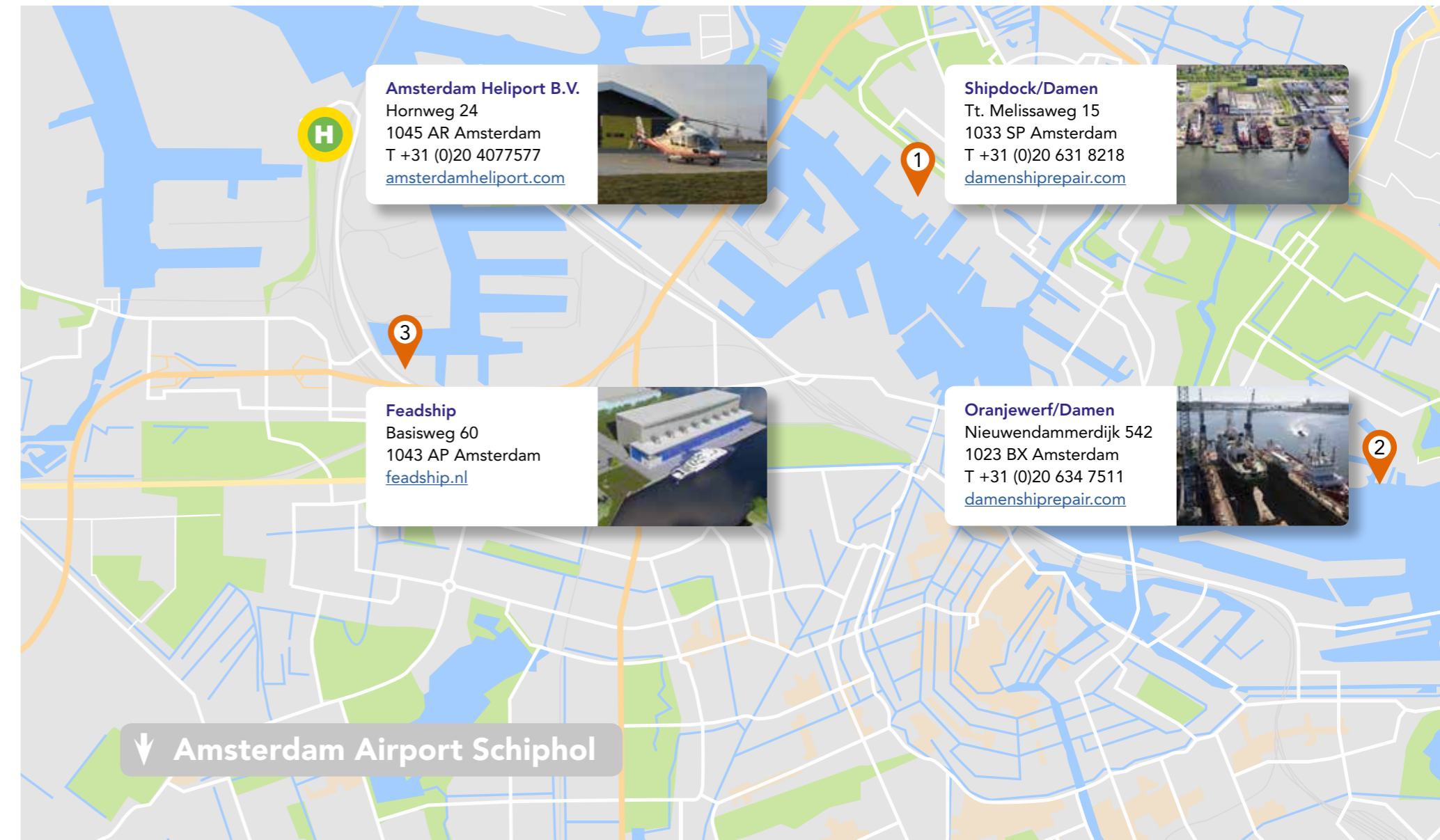

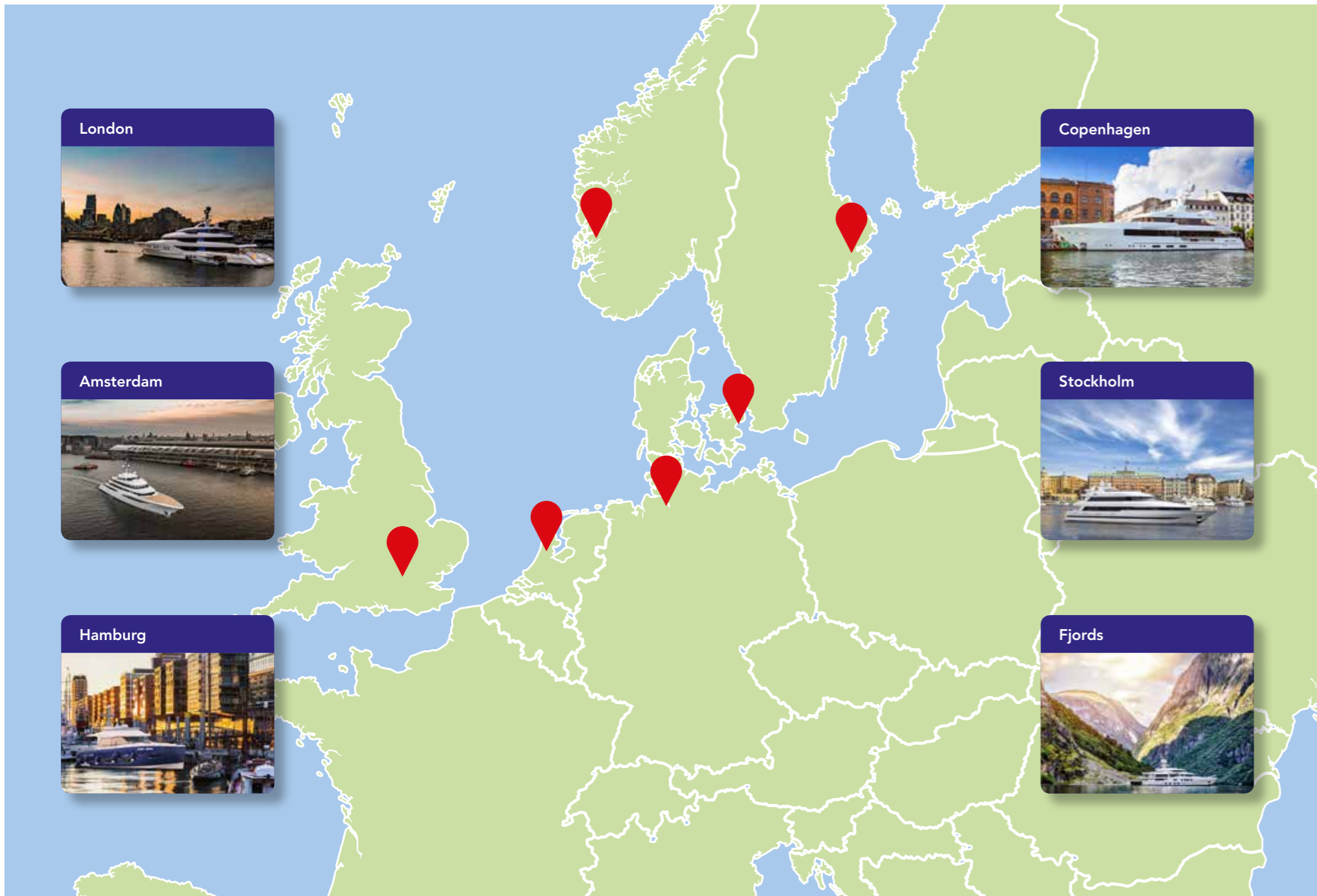
